Fire Situation:

The Silver Complex is comprised of five lightning fires burning in the Sierra National Forest. Yesterday, winds remained light, allowing fire fighters to continue making good progress on all fires. The Westfall Fire, burning south of Fish Camp, is now 100 percent contained. The Silver Knob Fire, burning north of Ahwahnee, is 60 percent contained. Today, fire fighters will continue to patrol and improve fire lines and watch for any problems on these fires. Priority will also be placed on getting fire fighters into the Star Lakes Fire, which is burning south of Yosemite National Park. The fire is burning in a remote inaccessible area of the forest. Ten smokejumpers have parachuted into the fire to begin constructing fire line.

Evacuations:

There are no evacuations or homes threatened by the Silver Complex Fires.

Road and Area Closures:

All roads and trails are open.

Health Advisories:

Drift smoke will affect the entire area. During the duration of the smoke conditions:

- Persons with asthma or other respiratory problems should avoid outdoor activities.
- All persons should avoid strenuous outdoor exercise.
- Anyone experiencing health problems should contact their primary care physician.
