 - a. Additional CEQA requirements to be handled, and CalFire has archaeology concerns that

- b. When workers under the MCRCD grant return, the focus will be on adjacent land within the National Park and Yosemite Conservancy land plots, but it's possible that some YW private lots may be able to get included, depending on who goes ahead and uses private contractors in the meantime.
- c. Trying to make sure they do all the work that's possible to do as soon as they can.
- d. No new grants on the horizon right now
- 5. YWDAC Meeting 9/14/2023
 - a. Whole new set of four officers at Public Works, all four of whom showed up in person to both the June and September meetings, which was a great improvement over recent years:
 - i. Shannon Hansen, Public Works Director
 - ii. Samuel Cerveny, Deputy Public Works Director
 - iii. John Luthi, Utilities (water+sewer) Manager
 - iv. Melinda Rice, Accounting
 - v. Leigh Westerlund, County assistant Administrative Officer
 - b. Thanked Mariposa Public Works for all their work on the water system in the spring
 - c. Mariposa County Accounting Status Update
 - i. County fiscal year starts every July 1
 - ii. Mariposa adopted a new account system from Oracle about 2 years ago. The year FY21 (starting 7/1/2020) was the last year fully in the old system (AS400). The year FY22 (starting 7/1/2021) was a messy transition, and accounting for FY23 (ending 6/30/2023) is still not finalized.
 - iii. Problems with the transition to the Oracle system have plagued many departments throughout Mariposa County, despite a \$2M investment in the software, training, and support. A recent article in the Mariposa Gazette describes the county-wide accounting situation.
 - iv. The end of FY carryover of funds (called the "fund balance") to each new FY is surprisingly a manual action the county has to remember to take and take accurately every year.
 - d. Mapping of accounts from the old accounting system to new Oracle system:

e. We pointed out that the revenues from payments made by YW property owners through property taxes for the 2004 bond have not been properly crediting into the Fund 4753 for FY22 and FY23, and so the auditors need to find those amounts (approx. \$300000) and

re-credit them.

- f. Likewise the fund balances from old 305, 754, and 755 accounts have disappeared in the new system, and the county CAO office needs to investigate where those funds went, and recredit them for Yosemite West. Perhaps fund 545 is a loan that has been forgiven based on the recommendation of the VTD auditors in 2014.
- g. YW Maintenance District Operations account
 - i. The main YWMD operations account is now 3322.
 - ii. At the June YWDAC meeting, there was a statement of YWMD finances at Ted's request. Using those numbers, the main YWMD operations account fund 3322 had a computed ytd fund balance of \$939,404

But we've now learned the county left a lot out, resulting in three rounds of corrections since then, including restating the last three years of labor-compensation costs. This was then restated again at the 9/14/2023 meeting. Expenses for FY23 have changed as follows:

third round of labor compensation added as transfers 9/14/2023	\$231,837
total all FY23 expenses reported now	\$781,742

- After these corrections the Fund 3322 fund balance at end of FY23 could be reduced to \$214918 but the situation is muddied due to the blending with Fund 3535, so their total fund balance is stated as a combined \$357386. The accounts will be re-separated during FY24.
- v. Maintenance Districts are the portions of the county handled directly by Public Works, and not independent utilities agencies such as service the downtown Mariposa town.
- vi. In terms of total dollars/effort of the 4 maintenance districts in Mariposa County, Yosemite West consumes about 50% of staff time. There's about 2.5 FTE of labor cost for YWMD (5 FTE for the county, about 50% for us).

- 6. Re-zoning application for 7548 Henness Circle
 - a. The county proposes to approve three actions at the October Board meeting:
 - i. Planning Commission adopting a Mitigated Negative-Impact Declaration (MND) to assert claims that the re-zoning proposal has "no significant impact" to traffic, noise, congestion, crowding, environment, or community character in Yosemite West.
 - ii. Planning Commission approving General Plan Zoning Amendment (GPZA) Application #2020-096 and Site Plan Review application #2023-064
 - iii. Planning Commission adopting an ordinance approving the re-zoning of the Scenic Wonders parcel APN 006-150-003 pursuant to GPZA #2020-096
 - b. Board of Supervisors hearing will come later (unclear as to what more considered) but not yet scheduled.
 - c. Many homeowners have sent letters to Mariposa Planning that will become part of the Planning Commission agenda packet.
 - d. Mariposa Planning Commission hearing scheduled for 10/6/2023.
